With such diversity, India has not just something but a lot to offer to all of its visitors.

North India, the prime destination, boasts diverse attractions. Crowned by the Western Himalayas, it features stunning landscapes in Ladakh, Kashmir, Uttarakhand, and Himachal Pradesh. The northwest, dominated by the Thar Desert in Rajasthan, showcases forts and palaces. Day 08 – Morning, excursion to Sarnath to see the sites where Lord Buddha delivered his first sermon. In time, transfer to the airport to board the flight to Delhi. Arrive Delhi and connect the international flight.



Day 06 - Morning, drive to Jaisalmer. Afternoon, visit Sam Sand Dunes, do a short camel ride there, and stay on to see the sunset from there.

Day 10 – Morning, drive to Udaipur visiting Jain Temple of Ranakpur en route. One of the largest Jain temples in India where its 1444 intricately carved pillars are unlike one another.

Day 11 - Morning, visit Udaipur City Palace, Saheliyon-Ki-Bari, and Bhartiya Lok Kala Museum. Late afternoon sunset boat cruise in the lake Pichola.

Day 12 - Morning, drive to Jaipur stopping by en route to visit Chittorgarh – the old capital of Mewar.

Day 13 - Morning, excursion to the ancient capital of Amber Fort with an elephant ride. Later in the day visit City Palace, Jantar Mantar (Astronomical Observatory), and Hawa Mahal.

Day 14 – Morning, drive to Agra visiting the deserted capital of Fatehpur Sikri en route. Upon arrival in Agra, drive straight to Mehtab Bagh to view the Taj Mahal by





Day 01 – Arrive Delhi

Day 04 - Morning, visit the Jai Vilas Palace, a 19th-century palace of Scindia's. Early afternoon drive to Orchha stopping by en route to visit Datia palace, a seven-story building built only with stones and bricks.

Day 05 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Orchha visiting its imposing palace, temples, and memorials.

Day 06 – Morning, drive to Khajuraho. Afternoon visit to the famous Khajuraho temple in Western Group (World Heritage Site). In the evening, watch sound and light show.

Day 07 – Morning, visit temples in Eastern Group. Later, drive to Jhansi railway station to board the train for Bhopal.

Day 08 - Morning, proceed on an excursion to visit Bhimbetka to see a cluster of pre-historic rock shelters. Return to Bhopal stopping by en route to visit Bhojpur temple. Afternoon, city tour of old Bhopal.

Day 09 – Morning, excursion to Sanchi to visit 3rd to 10th-century old Buddhist stupas. Afternoon, take the train to Agra.

Day 10 – Morning, excursion to visit the deserted Mughal capital of Fatehpur Sikri. Afternoon visit to the tomb of Itmad-ud-daulah followed by a visit to Mehtab Bagh to watch Taj Mahal by sunset from across the river.

Day 11 - Morning, visit the Taj Mahal to witness the monument changing its mood with the changing lights of the rising sun. Later in the morning, visit Agra Fort and drive to Delhi International Airport to board the international flight.

Mumbai and Aurangabad Tour (CI 006)


Duration: 06 Nights/ 07 Days

Destinations: Mumbai – Aurangabad

Highlights: Explore the dynamic cityscape of Mumbai and the charming western ghats. Immerse yourself in the ancient wonders of Elephanta, Ajanta, and Ellora Caves, marveling at exquisite rock-cut caves, sculptures, and murals that unveil India's rich cultural and architectural heritage.

Day 01 – Arrive Mumbai

Day 02 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Mumbai, visiting some of the important sites i.e. Mani



Bhawan, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus, Marine Drive.

Day 03 – Morning, reach Gateway of India to embark on a ferry excursion to Elephanta Caves to visit 5th to 7th centuries rock-cut temples. Afternoon, fly to Aurangabad.

Day 04 – Morning, excursion to Ajanta Caves, a UNESCO World Heritage site renowned for their ancient rock-cut Buddhist cave temples adorned with exquisite paintings and sculptures, dating back to the 2nd century BCE to 480 CE.

Day 05 – Morning, excursion to Ellora Caves. Afternoon, visit Bibi-ka-Maqbara and Panchakki. Early evening flight to Mumbai and transfer to the international airport to board the homeward flight.

Karnataka – Heritage Tour (CI 007)

Duration: 09 Nights/ 10 Days

Destinations: Bengaluru – Mysore – Hassan - Hospet – Badami

Highlights: Visit the best destinations of Karnataka. Delve into the cultural, and architectural heritage of many powerful dynasties that ruled this region at different spaces of history.

Day 01 – Arrive Bengaluru

Day 02 – Morning, proceed on a tour of Bengaluru visiting Vidhan Soudha, Cubbon Park, Lal Bagh, and Tipu Sultan Palace.

Day 03 – Morning, drive to Mysore, visiting Tipu Sultan's summer palace at Srirangapatnam. Afternoon excursion to Somnathpur to visit Kesava Temple, one of the best examples of Hoysala temples.

Day 04 – Morning, visit to Chamundeshwari Temple at Chamundi Hills and walk down 1000 steps visiting Nandi Bull (a huge rock-hewn) en route. Later visit Mysore Palace. Afternoon drive to Hassan, visiting 57 feet tall monolith, a statue of Bahubali at Shravanabelagola en route.

Day 05 – Day return excursion to Belur and Halebid to visit Hoysala Temples, considered to be architectural marvels.

Day 06 – Drive to Hospet, visiting Chitradurga Fort en route, built by successive dynasties between the 10th to 18th centuries.

Day 07 – Morning, proceed on a day-return excursion to Hampi. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, boasts ancient ruins, intricate temples like Virupaksha, majestic stone chariots at Vittala, Lotus Mahal, and the awe-inspiring Elephant Stables, capturing rich history and architecture.



Day 08 – Morning, drive to Badami. Afternoon sightseeing tour of Badami visiting Badami Caves, temples, fort and museum.

Day 09 – Morning, day return excursion to visit the temples of Aihole and Pattadakal which are famous for their architecture and historical importance.

Day 10 – In time, transfer to Hubli airport to board the flight for Bengaluru. Arrive in Bengaluru and transfer to the international airport to board the international flight.

Tamil Nadu Temple Tour (CI 008)

Duration: 09 Nights/ 10 Days

Destinations: Chennai – Mahabalipuram – Pondicherry – Tanjore - Madurai

Highlights: *In this tour, one gets to explore the important destinations of South India. Explore the Dravidian architectural excellence in the form of its towering temples. Uncover the region's rich history, shaped by great dynasties, and immerse yourself in its vibrant culture.*

Day 01 – Arrive Chennai

Day 02 – Morning, proceed on a tour of Chennai visiting the Museum, Fort St. George, Marina Beach, Saint Tom Cathedral, and Kapileshwar Temple.

Day 03 – Morning, drive to Mahabalipuram, visiting Kanchipuram en route. In Kanchipuram, visit Kanchi Kamakshi Amman Temple, Kailasanathar Temple, Kanchi Kudil, and Kanchipuram Silk Saree Weaving Centres.

Day 04 – Morning, sightseeing tour of Mahabalipuram, visiting Shore Temple, Pancha Rathas, Arjuna's Penance, Krishna's Butter Ball, and rock-cut temples. Late afternoon drive to Pondicherry.

Day 05 – Morning, proceed on an excursion to Auroville a unique concept of a global village. Afternoon, visit Sri Aurobindo Ashram, Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and walk around French Quarter.

Day 06 – Morning, drive to Tanjore, visiting Natraj Temple at Chidambaram and Airateswara Temple at Darasuram en route.

Day 07 – Morning, visit over to 1000-year-old Sri Brihadeshwara Temple, one of the biggest temples in India. Afternoon visit to 16th-century Tanjore Palace, Art Gallery, Saraswathi Mahal Library, Sangeet Mahal (Music Hall) and Museum.

Day 08 – Morning, proceed on a day return excursion to Trichy visiting Sriranganathaswamy Temple spread over an area of 600 acres at Srirangam, and the Rock Fort Temple.

Day 09 – Drive to Madurai, visiting the quaint town of Chettinad which is famous for its old



mansions. Evening visit to Meenakshi Temple to witness the evening ceremony.

Day 10 – Morning, visit to Meenakshi Temple and 17th-century Thirumalai Nayak Palace a fine example of Indo-saracenic architecture. Afternoon or early evening flight to Chennai and transfer to international airport to board the international flight.

Note: One can extend the tour to Kerala from here if desired.

Kerala 'God's Own Country' Tour (CI 009)

Duration: 09 Nights/ 10 Days

Destinations: Cochin – Munnar – Thekkady – Backwaters - Kovalam

Highlights: Long white shorelines of the Arabian Sea, golden beaches, stretches of tranquil backwaters, and resplendent blue Nilgiri Hills - a must-visit destination, Kerala, also called "God's Own Country" is the land of Ayurveda.

Day 01 – Arrive Cochin

Day 02 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Fort Cochin, visiting the 16th-century Dutch Palace, Jews Town, Pardesi Synagogue (the oldest active synagogue in the Commonwealth of Nations), St Francis Church the oldest European church in India, Chinese Fishing Nets etc. In the evening, witness a Kathakali dance performance.

Day 03 – Morning, drive to Munnar stopping by en route at waterfalls like Cheepara or Valara. Afternoon at leisure to take walk around the hill station.

Day 04 – Morning, visit to tea plantation and Kannan Devan Hills Plantation Company, Munnar is also called the Ripple Tea Museum. Afternoon, explore local markets and surrounding areas.

Day 05 – Morning, drive to Thekkady, visiting spice plantation en route. Afternoon game viewing boat ride in Periyar National Park.

Day 06 – Morning, visit to an elephant camp. Afternoon game viewing boat ride in Periyar National Park. Evening, explore Kumily local market, which is very famous for spice shops.

Day 07 – Morning, drive to Kumarakom jetty for an overnight Houseboat cruise in the backwaters.

Day 08 – Late morning, end cruise at Alleppey jetty and drive to Kovalam. Rest of the day at leisure or free for optional activities (one can relax on the beach or enjoy rejuvenating Ayurvedic massages).

Day 09 – Day at leisure or free for optional activities.

Day 10 – Morning, proceed on a sightseeing tour of Trivandrum, visiting the imposing Padmanabhaswamy Temple, Puthu Maliga Palace Museum, Napier Museum, and Sree



Chitra Art Gallery. Return to the hotel by late afternoon followed by transfer to Trivandrum airport to board the flight for onward destination.

Kolkata Sikkim and Darjeeling Tour (CI 0010)

Duration: 08 Nights/ 09 Days

Destinations: Kolkata – Gangtok – Pelling - Darjeeling

Highlights: *One of the scenic holiday destinations in the Eastern Himalayas, Sikkim, and Darjeeling offers some memorable experiences to its visitors. Enchanting Tibetan Buddhist Monasteries, panoramic view of the Himalayas, world famous Darjeeling Tea, and chugging of the 150 years old steam powered narrow gauge train are some of the highlights of the visit here.*

Day 01 – Arrive Kolkata

Day 02 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Kolkata, visiting Mother Teresa's Home, Victoria Memorial, BBD Bagh, Kalighat Temple, Howrah Bridge etc.

Day 03 – Morning, flight to Bagdogra followed by a drive to Gangtok.

Day 04 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Gangtok, visiting Rumtek Dharma Chakra, Enchey Monastery, Do-Drul Chorten, Research Institute of Tibetology, and Directorate of Handicrafts & Handloom. Stroll around MG Road in the evening.

Day 05 – Drive to Pelling through scenic locales of Sikkim.

Day 06 – Morning, excursion to the sacred Khecheopalri Lake. Later visit Pemayangtse Monastery and Rabdentse ruins.

Day 07 – Morning, drive to Darjeeling

Day 08 – Early morning, excursion to Tiger Hill to watch sunrise on the Himalayas. Return to the hotel visiting Ghoom Monastery en route. Later in the morning, sightseeing tour of Darjeeling visiting the Tibetan Refugee Self Help Centre, Himalayan Mountaineering Institute for Everest Museum, and the unique Zoological Park (Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park). Afternoon, explore the local market or stroll around the Mall.

Day 09 – Morning, take 150 years old Toy Train joy ride to Ghoom and back. Later in the morning, drive to Bagdogra airport to board the flight for Kolkata. Arrive Kolkata and connect international flight for onward destination.

Northeast India Tour (CI 0011)

Duration: 20 Nights/ 21 Days

Destinations: Delhi – Shillong – Cherrapunji – Guwahati – Kaziranga – Majuli – Ziro – Mon – Mokokchung – Tuophema - Kohima



Highlights: *This tour takes you to the most unexplored destinations in India. Northeast India is an unexplored paradise, a delight to nature lovers, and a treasure trove for anthropologists. Each state of Northeast India has its unique features like the wettest place on earth, the biggest freshwater island in the world, Living Root Bridge, Kaziranga a 'World Heritage Site', tribes of Arunachal and Nagaland etc.*

Day 01 – Arrive Delhi

Day 02 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Delhi visiting Qutab Minar, Humayun's Tomb, Government buildings, Jama Masjid, rickshaw ride in Chandni Chowk and Raj Ghat (Mahatma Gandhi Memorial).

Day 03 – Morning, flight to Guwahati and drive to Shillong.

Day 04 – Full-day sightseeing tour of Shillong visiting Don Bosco Museum, Burra Bazar, or Idew Market and the Archery, a unique feature of Shillong.

Day 05 – Morning, drive through a very picturesque landscape to Mawlynnong to visit the cleanest village in Asia. Also, visit the 'Living Root Bridge' of Riwai en route. Later drive to Cherrapunji, the wettest place on earth.

Day 06 – Full-day explore Cherrapunji. Visit Mawsmai Cave, and walk around the surrounding area enjoying numerous waterfalls and view enjoy the view of plains of Bangladesh.

Day 07 – Morning, depart Cherrapunji for Guwahati (150 Km) stopping by en route to visit Elephant Waterfalls and Umiam Lake. Afternoon, visit Kamakhya Temple. Evening, take a sunset cruise on the mighty Brahmaputra River.

Day 08 – Morning, drive to Kaziranga. Afternoon, game viewing drive in the central range of Kaziranga National Park.

Day 09 – Morning, game viewing drive in the eastern range of Kaziranga National Park. Afternoon, game viewing drive in the western range of Kaziranga National Park.

Day 10 – Early morning, elephant ride in Kaziranga National Park. Later in the morning, drive to Nimatighat to take a two-hour ferry to Majuli the largest freshwater island in the world and home to the Missing tribe. Afternoon, explore Majuli. Evening, visit a Satara the hub of art, culture, and religion activities in Assam.

Day 11 – Morning, take an hour-long ferry to Lakhimpur and then drive to Ziro Apatani tribal region in Arunachal Pradesh.

Day 12 – Full-day, explore Apatani tribal villages in the surrounding areas, known once for their tattooed faces impressive ornaments and headgear.

Day 13 – Morning, explore surrounding tribal villages. Late morning drive back to Lakhimpur to board a ferry to Majuli.



Day 14 - Morning, take a ferry to Nimatighat and then drive to Mon in (Nagaland) stopping by en route to visit Sibsagar, the old capital of Ahom Kingdom.

Day 15 – Morning, drive to Longwa village in the Indo-Myanmar border which is home to the Konyak Naga tribe. Konyaks are an erstwhile headhunting tribe who were very good with gunsmithing, iron-smelting, brass works, and gunpowder-making. Afternoon, explore Shangkhachingnyu village to learn more about this tribe.

Day 16 – Morning, drive to Mokokchung, the land of Ao Naga, the largest tribal group in Nagaland. Ao Naga's are known for making impressive materials made out of bamboo, colourful shawls and wraparounds, headgear, etc.

Day 17 – Full-day explore Ao Naga villages to learn more about the history, culture, and life of this tribe. Some of the highlights of today's visit will be seeing a museum, wooden pillars depicting the legend of the 'life cycle' believed by the Ao, the largest log drum, etc.

Day 18 – Morning, drive to Tuophema visiting one of the oldest Ao Naga villages en route which used to be the epicentre during the headhunting days. Also, visit the Lotha Naga tribal village en route who are known for their flamboyant attire, dances, and folk songs.

Day 19 – Full-day explore Tuophema, the land of the Angami Naga tribe, one of the most fierce and respected Naga tribes for their bravery.



Day 20 – Morning, drive to Kohima. Visit the State Museum en route. Afternoon, visit the World War II cemetery.

Day 21 – Morning, drive to Dimapur airport to board the flight for Delhi. Arrive Delhi and connect the international flight.

Ladakh - 'The Rooftop of The World' (CI 0012)

Duration: 10 Nights/ 11 Days


Destinations: Delhi – Leh – Hunder (Nubra Valley) – Pangong Lake






